Annual Report for Fiscal Year 2018

We are proud to report that this past year was one of continued success and achievement by Flinthills Services and the many people we serve. Flinthills is dedicated to providing the highest quality of supports to Kansas with disabilities in Butler County and in 2018, that meant providing individualized, person-centered services to over 150 individuals and their families. Each achievement, each measure of success is an individual one: earning that first paycheck, learning to cook a meal, scoring the winning basket at Special Olympics, or any of the hundreds of ways that the people we serve progress towards full, rich lives.

Flinthills Services offers an array of services that enable us to serve people as their needs change, and to help them achieve their life goals. This year we joined forces with the former Arc of Butler and expanded our programs to include Special Olympics, Young Adult and Teen Fun Nights. Flinthills also works as part of a network that includes our state association Interhab, CARF International, local and state elected officials, other provider agencies, foundations, and private supporters, volunteers, friends and neighbors. We can be, and have been, most successful when we work in partnership with all the member described as our network.

Today, the need for the services that Flinthills provides has never been greater- not just in numbers of people who need our services, but also the magnitude of the challenges many of these individuals face. A teenager with autism abandoned at a rest stop, a young woman with cerebral palsy removed from her home due to unsafe living conditions, age-related issues such as dementia facing the growing number of seniors we serve, the complicated medical challenges facing young people dually diagnosed with mental illness and developmental disabilities – all these issues put more and more demand on our programs and services. However, we are up to the challenge as we continue to modify and improve services to meet these changing needs.

While we continue to grow, it has never been Flinthills' goal to be the biggest agency, but rather the best. We are very fortunate to have a tremendous group of directors, managers, and staff who strive to treat each person we serve as they would want a loved one to be treated. That commitment, and the continued support we receive from all of you, allows us to deliver the highest quality services each and every day.

Demographics – 2017-18

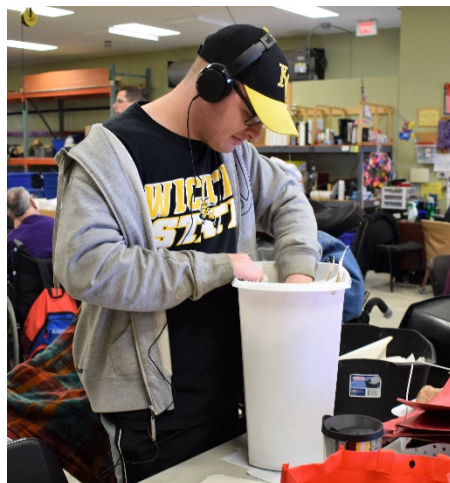

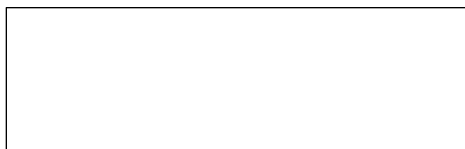
